Safeguarding and Welfare

Ongoing Safeguarding

At NELGC we are committed to safeguarding all of our members, gymnasts, coaches and volunteers. Coaches of all levels regularly attend safeguarding training and all staff members over 16 complete an Enhanced DBS check. **Every member of staff and volunteer working for NELGC has a responsibility to safeguard children.**



Emergency contact information:

It is extremely important that we have current contact details for the main contact and also up to date and available emergency contacts for each gymnast. Please can you check that your details are correct and also that you have 2 emergency contacts. Whilst we will always endeavour to contact the named parent/carer for your gymnast, if this is not possible, we do then phone the emergency contacts. You can check and amend your details, by logging into the ThinkSmart Portal – My Account – My details. Please check your phone number is correct (often we find that there may just not be enough numbers) and that the 2 emergency contacts are current and accurate. Many thanks.

We always want the gymnasts to have a positive experience at NELGC, so a few ways to ensure they can get the most out of their time in the gym:

Prompt arrival at the beginning and the end of sessions.

Arriving on time for the session means the gymnasts can get the most out of their time in the gym and we are able to keep everyone safe inside the building – a priority for the whole team. Please remember that you can notify us on the ThinkSmart Portal if you are running late and the coach will be informed on the class register. Collecting promptly reduces your gymnast's anxiety and minimises the impact on other sessions when a coach is out of the gym.

Making sure you gymnast is in the correct clothing and isn't bringing unnecessary items into the gym. Being in the correct clothing means that no time is lost during the session and develops the gymnasts sense of belonging to the club. As any clothing needs to be placed in a bucket and be carried by the gymnast, just bringing shoes, a water bottle and wearing their leotard/shorts and onesie is best. We don't want precious or valuable belongings to be lost so ask that such items are not brought into the club.

Removing jewellery – especially earrings – before sessions. Ensuring hair is tied back securely off your gymnast's face and long hair plaited. Hair beads and other hard hair adornments are removed. These points are intended to keep the gymnasts safe during their class.

We would like to remind gymnast's that they can speak to any member of staff if they are unsure or worried about something. For any welfare concerns we have a dedicated email address welfare@nelgc.org which can also be linked to directly from the website.

We are keen to expand the Safeguarding and Welfare team at the club. If you have an interest and a current child protection qualification do get in touch using the welfare email address.
